WEAVER ROAD NEARS COMPLETION

Over the forthcoming weeks, the final tranches of work should be completed in the Weaver Road play area.

The renovated green space has been transformed into a quiet area with storytelling chairs and an array of stools. There will also be a picnic bench with a gaming table, a Mud Kitchen, a book box, a defibrillator and the entire area will be protected by CCTV.





The council will announce the opening shortly, when the work is completed and such facilities can be utilised.

CLLR DILLON JOINS THE COUNCIL

MOULTON PLAYING FIELDS UPDATE

Moulton Parish Council would like to thank Cllr Jo Kershaw for her time, resources and efforts in transforming the flowerbed underneath the flagpole. New plants include Rosemary, Blackcurrants, Hollyhocks, Sunflowers, Strawberries, Crocosmia, Campanula, Sage, Thyme and Geraniums. Any green-fingered parishioners who want to help maintain these flowerbeds should contact the council.

In the coming weeks, a new 2.1m height restriction barrier will be installed on the entrance to the Moulton Playing Fields car park. This will help protect our space from illegal encampment, that cost the council a considerable sum to address over the Christmas period. The winning project for the CIL money was the path across the park, linking School Lane with Honeyvale Gardens and the council have received quotes for the work. This scheme has been hampered by the Coronavirus lockdown, but the council are hoping to make a choice of contractor in the coming weeks, with a desire to lay the path before the end of the Summer.

Moulton Parish Council also debated the current closure of the MUGA and the Playground and have opted to keep all play equipment closed until further notice. This is due to the high "R" value in the local area and the lack of inspections. The council agreed on the criteria that will need to met for the areas to be reopened: the local "R" value is estimated to be 0.5 or lower, the equipment has passed safety inspections and this is no conflicting guidance from the Government or scientific community. Children should be reminded to refrain from using all of the equipment until it reopens.
