WEAVER ROAD TO OPEN THIS MONTH



Next week, the final tranches of work will be completed in the extensive regeneration of Weaver Road quiet play area aimed at younger children in the community. The renovated play space has been transformed into a quiet area with a storytelling chair and stools, and additional seating. There is also a picnic bench with a gaming table, a Mud Kitchen, a bug hotel and blackboard. A defibrillator has been added outside the area. The entire area will be protected by CCTV. The council will announce the opening date via our Facebook page.





The parish council owes a debt of thanks to Cllr Angela Bush, as well as Cllr Jo Kershaw, who have spent many hours working on the site, along with a small army of volunteers, to prepare the play area for use by the community. Due to the proximity to residential properties, users of the facility are requested to be respectful when entering, leaving or using the play area.



As this area is for the use of children, dogs are NOT permitted on this area at any time.







OTHER NEWS

In view of the updated guidance from the Government, and the ability for the council to inspect the MUGA and equipment, the play equipment on Moulton Playing Fields has now reopened. The council would like to thank the vast majority of Moultoners who abided by the rules and have supported the council throughout.

The council is disappointed that there was some vandalism to the fencing during the lock down, and the parish council will incur a bill in remedying the damage caused.

The council have received repeated reports of dog excrement being left on the grass of the playing field. The council are reluctant to restrict access to dogs to the playing field, but due the health hazards of

canine excrement to human health and the need to protect the users on the park, the council will reconsider this decision if the dog waste continues. We implore all dog owners to be be responsible and clear up after their dogs.

The parish council have signed the first of the legal documents for the Regent Street Redevelopment project. This does not form a planning application.

The council is very keen to keep the community informed of every step and will issuing communications via our usual channels (Parish Noticeboard using lilac paper, Facebook and MPC Website). The council will also leaflet every property that borders the site, in the next few weeks, explaining the various steps and where possible giving estimated timescales.
